CDC Budget Overview

The total FY 2025 request for CDC funding is **\$9.683 billion** in discretionary budget authority, Prevention and Public Health Funds (PPHF), and PHS Evaluation Transfers.

This is an increase of **\$499.2 million** over the FY 2023 enacted level.

FY 2025 Budget Request



Protects national security and the U.S. economy by **rapidly identifying and responding** to everything from disease outbreaks to environmental hazards.



Invests in state and local public health infrastructure, **building a strong workforce** with core systems and robust data to protect everyone's health.



Strengthens local efforts to **fight disease and tackle critical health priorities** like overdose prevention, poor mental health, suicide, Adverse Childhood Experiences, and violence.



Supports surveillance systems like wastewater that show what diseases pose the greatest health risk to the public.



Expands initiatives for better access to maternal health and successful cancer prevention and control programs.

In 2023, CDC's Public Health Emergency Preparedness (PHEP) Cooperative Agreements partly or wholly funded 3,131 staff positions across 62 PHEP jurisdictions, filling critical gaps in local public health emergency response.



For the 2022-2023 influenza season, influenza vaccinations prevented nearly 6,000,000 cases, 2,900,000 hospitalizations, and 3,700 deaths from influenza infection.

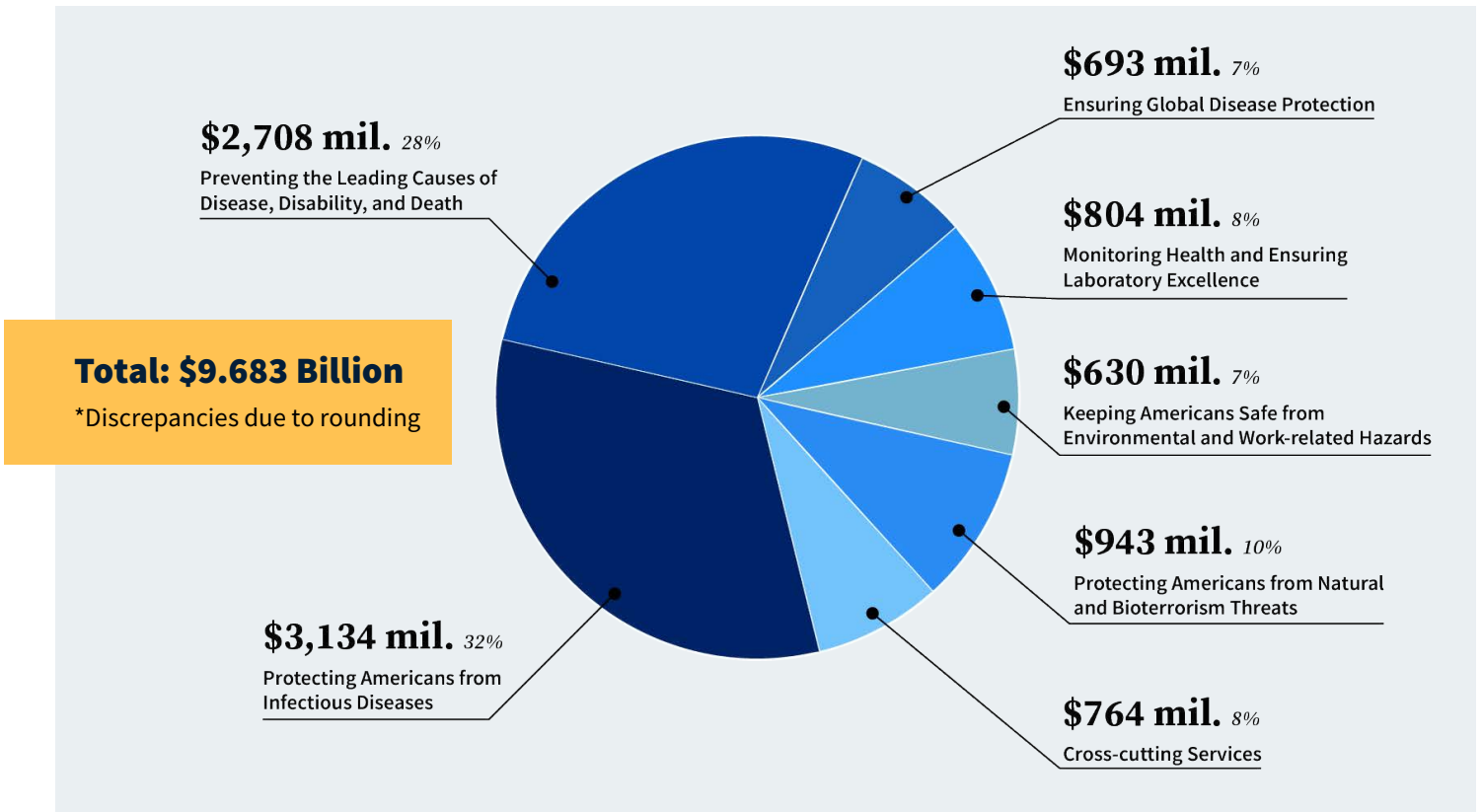


CDC's partnership with the Democratic Republic of Congo's (DRC) Ministry of Health helped to rapidly detect and defeat a 2022 Ebola virus outbreak in just 48 hours, killing only five people. In 2018, the same virus took nearly four months to detect and killed 2,200 people in the DRC.



Since 2017, the National Breast and Cervical Cancer Early Detection Program provided over 1,500,000 screenings, detecting 13,784 breast cancers and 26,702 precancerous cervical lesions.
