ADVISE.

BAs gather and provide program partners with information to make timely and informed decisions throughout the budget execution lifecycle: planning, execution, and closeout. Through close collaboration with program partners, BAs play a vital part in the system of checks and balances.

PLAN.

BAs provide planning guidance and direction to program partners, which enables them to create sound and efficient spend plans used to execute budgets.

APPROVE.

The buck stops here. BAs certify funds in accordance with Federal Appropriations Law (FAL) to ensure all acquisitions are in compliance with purpose, time, and amount.
