

Percentage of Total Deaths, by Age and Hispanic Origin and Race*,† — United States, 2020



Abbreviations: Al/AN = American Indian or Alaska Native; NH/OPI = Native Hawaiian or other Pacific Islander.

Significant differences in the age distribution of deaths by race and ethnicity were observed in the United States during 2020. Decedents aged <65 years accounted for 26% of all U.S. deaths, but they accounted for approximately 50% of deaths among Al/AN and NH/OPI persons, 40% of deaths among Black or African American (Black) and Hispanic or Latino (Hispanic) persons, and 20% of deaths among Asian and White persons. Smaller differences were noted among persons aged 65–84 years. Among persons aged ≥85 years, the pattern was reversed, with the percentage of all deaths ranging from approximately 11% among Al/AN and NH/OPI persons to 33% for Asian and White persons.
